Packed Lunches and Snacks

School Meals on Thursday 6th October

The school receives funding for providing free school meals for all **Reception**, **YI** and **Y2** children. It is that time of year again. It may seem early to be making these preparations but on the run up to October half term children will be coming home with designs for Christmas and celebration cards which you are invited to order, for December delivery. - I. Your child's artwork will come home stuck to an order sheet, with a unique order code.
- 2. Parents place an order an pay online using the unique order code.

- 4. Orders will be delivered to school for distribution at the beginning of December.

If you would like an additional order from for siblings please ask at the school office. It is not possible to add more than one piece of artwork to one order code.
