#### Out and About

About nine years ago Mayfield was invited to work with Cambridge Curiosity and Imagination (CCI) on a project developing and imagining ideas for the outdoor communal spaces at the new development – Edington. The project involved the children working outside, designing, collaborating and sharing ideas. As the project progressed the children had the opportunity to teach PGCE students at Cambridge Faculty of Education to be 'artscapers' and to share the joy and benefits of outdoor learning on two occasions with an All Party Parliamentary Group discussing creativity in schools. Once at the Houses of Parliament and also via Zoom during pandemic times.

What we noticed was how children thrived when learning outside. For some it was a space where 'no-one was looking over their shoulder', where they could 'walk and talk and discuss learning'. We saw children who outside of the classroom were able to taking leading roles in tasks and feel more confident to share their ideas.

We decided that this was something we wanted all children to experience and given our lovely grounds felt it was something we could provide. Teachers engaged in training sessions, and began to look at the curriculum and plan how they could successfully take some of the learning outside.

We continue to provide weekly sessions of out and about, share ideas on what areas of the curriculum work well outside, share planning ideas and monitor the outcomes through pupil voice, pupil review meetings and teacher feedback.

#### **Spirals of Inquiry**

Spirals of Inquiry is an adaptive, child-focused approach to teaching and learning. It is about continually reviewing, reflecting, adapting and reviewing practise in order to gain a greater understanding of children's needs and adapt teaching appropriately. It was created by Linda Kaiser and Judy Halbert and used in schools across British Columbia. Having reviewed the approach carefully we decided to adopt it at Mayfield. We have always been a child centred school, and this was another tool to add to our toolkit. Over the course of the last five years we have run 'Spirals Weeks' In these weeks teachers have the opportunity to spend 30 minutes with each child in their class. During this time they add pieces of work that your child is proud of to a learning journal and add notes for them to say why they are proud of particular tasks they have done. The teacher also asks a set of questions: Which two people do you think believes that you can be successful in school? What's going on with your learning? Where to next? A question is also asked that is pertinent to their classroom to gain a deeper understanding of learning in their own classroom setting. These conversations are recorded and added to the children's learning journals. At the end of the school year the journals go home as part of the final report. We are currently in discussion as to whether these journals remain a physical book or become an online document.

During the conversations the rest of the class are engaged with activities ranging from a morning with a specialist sports coaches, child led projects, reviews of the half terms topics, special assemblies.

These weeks are constantly reviewed in order to support the children and the teachers to gain the best educational outcomes. This year there will be Spirals conversations in the autumn and spring term for years I to 4. The current year five will have an additional conversation towards the end of the summer term with their year six teacher. This year sixes had their summer term conversation with their new teachers and will have a day after half term to reflect on their residential trip which is coming up soon, and a further conversation in the spring term

Our school now 'thinks in spirals'. Our school development plan's Aims are laid out as inquiries, where teams of colleagues lead on progressing the aims whilst continually reflecting on the progress we are making towards and the direction the next steps should take.

Staff appraisal includes a similar conversation to those teachers have with children. We have all found these conversations to be invaluable over the last two years. They have supported us to recognise and share good practise more effectively, they have supported us in recognising how we support one another in school and they have supported conversations around individual professional development.

Where we have a question about the school we will employ a 'spirals' approach to finding a solution.
