The Key Stage 2 events run from 13:00 to 15:00. You are invited to follow your child around each event at a safe distance to cheer them on as they complete their sporting activities. Please stay outside if you have attended the picnic. If you arrive for the afternoon activities only, please enter the school via the School Office from 12:45 to sign in.
